Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. "Philippians 4:4-7"

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice."

These words from Philippians 4:4 are some of the most well-known and beloved in all of Scripture. They are also among the most challenging. How do we rejoice always? In a world filled with uncertainty, illness, division, and grief—is this just wishful thinking?

The Apostle Paul writes these words from a prison cell. He is awaiting judgment, his future uncertain. And yet, even in those bleak circumstances, he encourages the church in Philippi to rejoice. This is not a superficial joy, but one deeply rooted in the presence and promise of God. Paul is not asking us to deny the painful realities of life. Rather, he is pointing us to a deeper truth: the Lord is near.

When Paul writes, "Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near," he is reminding us that God has not abandoned us. This nearness of God gives us courage to live differently, to respond to the world not with fear, but with gentleness and hope. God's closeness invites us into a peace that the world cannot give. Paul then invites us to bring everything to God in prayer, to not carry our burdens alone. We are invited into an honest and intimate relationship with God.

And what is the result? "The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." This peace is not simply a feeling of calm. It is an active force that guards us, protects us, holds us steady even, and especially, when the storms come. It is a peace that doesn't always make sense—because it comes not from circumstances, but from Christ.

In our Lutheran tradition, we trust that God meets us in real life—in bread and wine, in water and Word, in gathering and service. Philippians 4 reminds us that God also meets us in anxiety and in prayer. In a world that constantly pushes us toward worry, this passage is a holy interruption, calling us back to God's promises, inviting us to rejoice, not because life is always easy, but because God is always faithful.

Thanks be to God. Amen.



Our Mission Dollars At Work

Over the next months, we will be sharing stories from Willie Langdji, our international missionary who serves as the ELCA Regional Rep for West and Central Africa. His stories highlight how the wonderful work we are involved in is transforming the lives of God's people and strengthening our sister church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Central African Republic (ELC-CAR).



From whole peanuts to 100% peanut oil by Willie Langdji

The Food Security Program of the ELC- CAR has provided technical and material support to subsistence farmers in the Nana-Mambere and Ouham Pende Prefectures of CAR for over 30 years. This support has helped the farmers grow food for their families and sell the surplus on local markets. Their produce has been sold to individual families and mainly to middle merchants who have enough resources to transport it to the cities and make more money. Over these years the program has evolved to respond to the needs of the small farmers. One aspect that has recently been addressed is related to the processing of some farm products.

The ELC-CAR's dream has been to add value to the agricultural products of the farmers and enable them to derive more benefit from their produce while at the same time ensuring that the Food Security Program becomes sustainable in the future. In this perspective, January 31, 2025, saw the inauguration of the first peanut oil extraction unit of the church. It is the first in the country by a faith-based organization and by a non-profit private entity. The unit has a production capacity of two tons of peanut oil per day.

Lay Ministry/Evangelism: Worship in the Park will be paused for 2025. There will be no Wednesday night worship in July.

Property/Stewardship: Concern over furnace repair expenses and 2025 budget line noted.

Plans are underway for parsonage deck replacement.

Old Business:

Capital Campaign pledges total \$178,000 with \$73,000 received. A second mailing is planned for remaining donors.

New Business:

Motion by Christina Anderson to approve \$100 benevolence to the Sorensen family and \$100 to Tony Clifton family, seconded by Jon Johnson. All in favor, motion carries.

Motion by Christina Anderson to approve confirmands Beau Baumbach, Megyn Bjerke, Kaylynn Chamberlain, Tatyn Heskin, Jaida Schumacher, Sophie Skogen, and Hannah Wobbema, seconded by Jon Johnson. All in favor, motion carries.

Pastor Amy led a discussion on expectations and boundaries in pastoral care. Council expressed support for establishing clearer written pastoral care visit protocols so that all church duties receive the amount of pastor's time that is required.

Governance Holy Experiment: Goals and measures were discussed including optimal term limits, possible board vs committee naming, council and board roles, and financial transparency. Things to consider in the future were to consolidate some of the church financial accounts, to set calendar-based governance checkpoints, to add Congregational Comment at the start of Council meetings, and to adjust the agenda to fit the Holy Experiment efficiency.

Motion by Colleen Semmens to adjourn with prayer, seconded by Fern Schuster. All in favor, motion carries.
