# pastor's ponderings

The 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly (CWA) was held July 28- August 2 at the Phoenix Convention Center, and I was blessed to one of approximately 800 voting delegates (elected at synod assemblies). CWA is the primary decision-making body of the whole ELCA. We convened under the theme "For the Life of the World" which celebrates the Nicene Creed's 1,700th anniversary.

We began the assembly by gathering for opening worship. Elizabeth Eaton, ELCA presiding bishop, delivered a sermon on Holy Communion as an act of resistance in a time of increasing division. "The world wants to divide us, but the eucharist brings us together," she said.

Each of the six days, we gathered for worship and prayer, along with doing the business of the church in eleven plenary sessions. In addition to the plenary business, we entered into times of Bible study, heard greetings and reports from leaders of ELCA, along with inter-religious, and ecumenical ministries:

Director of the Network for Religious and Traditional Peacemakers Auxiliary bishop of the Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore

President and general secretary of the National Council of Churches Director of the Department of Inter-Orthodox, Ecumenical and Inter-

faith Relations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America

Representatives of the Lutheran World Federation (LWF)

Chair of the Church of Norway Committee on Ecumenical Relations.

#### **ELECTIONS**

One of the primary tasks before us was to elect two officers of our church-the Presiding Bishop (president) and Church Secretary (executive officer). Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected as Presiding Bishop (6-year term) and Rev. CeCee Wills was elected as Secretary (6-year term).

Rev. Curry currently serves as Bishop of the Metro Chicago Synod and is also the president of the Conference of Bishops (all 65 synod bishops of our church). Rev. Mills has served as an assistant to the bishop in the North Carolina Synod since 2019. They are both the first people of color elected to their respective roles in the ELCA.

#### **BUSINESS HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Passed the "Faith and Civic Life" social statement as called for by the 2019 Churchwide Assembly.
- \* Updated repudiation of the "Doctrine of Discovery" which allowed European, and later American, nations to claim lands occupied by Indigenous or other non-European, non-Christian people as federal property.
- \* Passed the balanced budget for 2026-2028, hearing gratitude from the bishop of the Eastern Lutheran Diocese in Namibia and the bishop of the Salvadoran Lutheran Church for the ELCA's support of their ministries.
- \* Passed language revisions to the "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust" social statement, that reflect current laws and more modern terms.
- \* Received report from the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC), which detailed recommendations for the church to act on now and considerations to discern into the next churchwide assembly in 2028.
- \* Amended a bylaw to increase the percentage goal of youth and young adult voting membership of Churchwide Assembly, Church Council, and churchwide boards and committees from 10 to 20%.
- \* Referred to the office of the secretary, a motion that would have changed the process and timing of amending the ELCA constitution. The original motion was put forward by the CRLC and received several amendments, and much pushback from members of the assembly.
- \* Defeated a motion to set a 2-term limit to the offices of the Presiding Bishop and Secretary.
- \* Referred to the Office of the Presiding Bishop, consideration of the ethics and morality surrounding AI (artificial intelligence).






